Outcome of the Consultation Report – Proposal to Establish a New Non-Denominational Primary School and Implement Catchment Changes to Address School Capacity and Accommodation Pressures in South East Edinburgh

As well as establishing a catchment area for the new primary school in south east Edinburgh, the proposal includes changes to the catchment areas of:

- · Gilmerton Primary School;
- Liberton Primary School;
- · Gracemount High School; and
- Liberton High School.



The report recommends that Council approves the proposal to establish a new non-denominational primary school and nursery in south east Edinburgh and implement the school catchment changes outlined in the statutory consultation paper.
