Spaces for People

The current temporary closure of Links Gardens is being recommended to Transport Committee for removal to accommodate the Tram construction works until summer 2022. Future reinstatement will be considered alongside the Leith LTN via consultation with local residents.

— Trees and Planting -

There is an opportunity to work alongside local groups to increase the amount of greenery in Leith by planting up trees, shrubs and flowers in wooden planters making spaces more attractive to spend time in.







Artwork -

Leith has a history of well-known murals and other public art. We're keen to add to this and develop pieces of new art that enhance the pocket parks and other existing public spaces.







Productive Gardens

There is already a well-established community garden at Leith Links. We've heard that there is a desire for even more space to be provided for local people to join together and grow their own fruit and vegetables.







— Seating

Seating provides a place to stop, meet and enjoy time relaxing. In addition, seating can be valuable for people with additional needs and accessing and enjoying their local outdoor spaces.



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


