- Outdoor spaces as educational resource for staff and community.




- Improve pedestrian access to campus from Union Canal.

- Net Zero Public Buildings Standard— Low embodied carbon construction.


### **Building Concept Diagram**

# **Site Phasing Strategy**




1: Existing Condition - Education facilities housed within blocks B, C, D and E. Block A is the existing building.



2: Phase 1 - Decant contents of blocks D and E into B & C. Assembly hall and blocks D and E then to be demolished.



3: Phase 2 - Construction of new high school building.



4: Phase 3- Demolition of blocks B and C following occupation of new building. External works concluded following demolition.

### **Site Strategy**

Building arrival space designed to create a people focussed flexible space which can be used by the community and visitors.

Creation of a large south facing courtyard which forms the main social space for pupils, 2 incorporating outdoor dining, cycle storage, seating and access to the main pupil entrance.


Access from the south via a new ramped footpath which connects the school directly to the canal tow path at a key junction off Wester Hailes Road. A secure gate and boundary will be located off the buildings eastern gable which leads to the southern play ground.


Series of bleacher style seats set into the bank and direct stepped access creates further links between the school and the canal.

The wider site includes outdoor learning spaces, with shelters and growing spaces.






View of south elevation from south-east at canal tow path.




View of north and east elevations from drop-off area.














